



What is this study about?

The ISSP is an early intervention and prevention initiative that is intended to provide essential services to address a variety of needs in diverse elementary schools. It aims to provide wraparound school supports which may include a positive police presence, on-site mental health worker, physical education teacher, social, access to a health clinician, breakfast and lunch programs, and after-school programs. We want to evaluate how well this program is working and we are asking you to help us by taking part in this study.

For those who have previously consented for your child to complete surveys for the ISSP program. This is a friendly reminder that your child will be completing the survey (e.g., social emotional wellbeing, school climate, and resilience) in the next two weeks.

Please remember that your child's participation in this questionnaire is completely voluntary. Even though you had originally consented that your child participates, you may withdraw your consent at any time up to two weeks after completing the survey each time. Your child may also decline to participate or to answer any or all of the questions.

What are we asking from students?

- 2x/year survey (~20 minutes)
- o Social emotional wellbeing
- o School climate
- o Resilience

Access to reading screeners your child completed at school.

Are there any risks to participating?

Minimal risk; possibly mild fatigue or emotional stress from completing surveys.

What are the benefits of participating?

- Understanding how well this program is serving your child's school.
- Having a voice in the programming as the information collected about the program will be used to inform future improvements.
