Impact of School Attendance on Life Success



The Centennial staff cares deeply for your students and want the best education possible for them. We have many interventions and supports in place to help students who need extra help, but we can make a bigger impact on their learning if they are here regularly. Keep making sure we see their smiling faces daily!

Research has shown that school attendance is a powerful predictor of student outcomes. In fact, irregular attendance can be a better predictor of whether students will drop out of school before graduation than test scores, according to the Department of Education.

The correlation between attendance and dropout rates has important ramifications that go beyond the classroom. Compared to their peers who graduate, students who fail to complete their high school education are more likely to live in poverty, suffer poor health, and become involved in the criminal justice system.
